Local Scholarships



With our successful Author's Day profits, silent auction, donations, and use of the King Sooper and Safeway cards proceeds, we are again able to offer five \$1,000 scholarships to women students at UCCS and PPCC. Application forms are available on our branch website (coloradosprings-co.aauw.net) and on the UCCS and PPCC websites under Scholarships. Women applicants with 36 completed credit hours, 3.0 GPA, and currently attending either PPCC or UCCS the spring semester of 2016, with intent to enroll in the fall 2016 at either PPCC or UCCS, are eligible to apply for our AAUW scholarship.

The financial aid counselors at both PPCC and UCCS have been in communication with our scholarship committee, and I have met with Aditi Mitra, our AAUW contact at UCCS, to promote the scholarships. Application forms have been distributed at the college/career centers, childcare centers where students who are also parents will be likely to see them.

Our local scholarship committee this year will be comprised of Linda McInay, Joann Oh, Margaret Baptist, Sally Metzger, and Charlotte Gagne, chairperson. Together we will read and evaluate the applications for 2016 and make our final determinations in April.

I would like to share correspondence from one of our 2015 scholarship winners, an early childhood education major, a woman who came to America when she was 11 years old from Mexico.

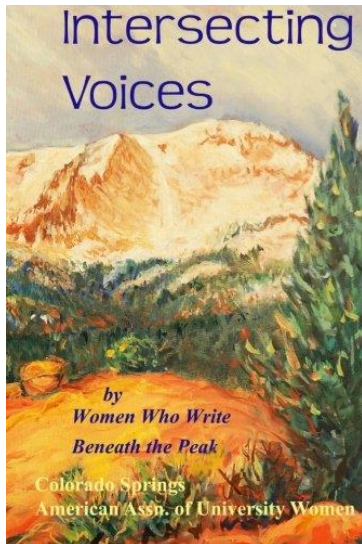

The Pikes Peak Community Dialogue

AAUW, along with the **Raising of America Pikes Peak Community Alliance** attracted 100 participants (in spite of the cold and snow!) to begin a months-long examination of early childhood in our community. Attendees included **Bill Murray, Tom Strand** and **Larry Bagley** from City Council; school board members **Linda Mojer, Luann Long, Elaine Naleski**, and a board member from district 49; **Diane Norton**, State AAUW President and representative of the Colorado Women's Coalition, and **Carla Hendrickson** from Pueblo, who is interested in replicating our effort there.

Following a lively discussion of issues raised in the groundbreaking documentary aired on RMPBS during January, we are urging organizations and individuals to host screenings and discussion groups at their workplace, organization meetings, places of worship, and in their homes in order to become informed about the early childhood issues impacting families. Armed with a better understanding of this complex issue, it is time for us as citizens to find out how this issue affects us all—and what we can do about it.

The DVD with all 5 episodes (in both English and Spanish) is available at Pikes Peak Library and Kramer Library at UCCS. The Gill Media Center is available (free) as a venue for larger groups.
