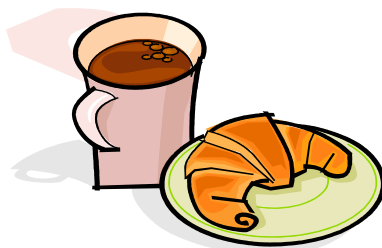

Our goal is to create a better informed public that will support family-friendly public policy for working parents.

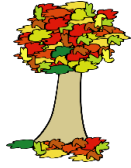
Saturday, September 12
