### JOB DESCRIPTION: PUBLIC POLICY DIRECTOR (or CO-DIRECTORS)

**Term:** Appointed by the president for a two-year term. May be reappointed. Responsibility: Serves on the board of directors, leads the Public Policy Event Committee, and serves on the Program Committee

**Duties:** 1) Attends state and regional conferences (and national convention, if possible), when expenses are available in the budget, in order to be informed about AAUW's current public policy issues. 2) Maintains contact with the State Public Policy Chair in order to keep the board and general membership informed regarding state advocacy issues. 3) Attends and promotes attendance at the State Public Policy Day. 4) Makes regular contributions to the branch newsletter to update members on AAUW's federal advocacy efforts, using AAUW press releases and Action Network as source material. 5) Chairs or co-chairs the Public Policy Events Committee to plan and execute at least two Branch Events pertaining to public policy topics related to AAUW's mission.

Also: 1) Works with community coalitions on voter education efforts. 2) Works with community partnerships and collaborations to address local mission-related issues. 3) Develops community collaborations to address local mission-related issues. 4) Serves as a resource person to the Public Policy Interest Group Chair.

Abe Minzer teaches piano, music history and music theory at University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. Also, Dr. Minzer is on the faculty at Pikes Peak Community College where he teaches Private Piano, Group Piano, Music Theory, serves as staff pianist/accompanist, and is head of the Piano Department. Dr. Abe Minzer often performs works of living composers, including world premieres of compositions by Sylvia Hazlerig, Jorge Cardoso, Jim Bosse and Ofer Ben-Amots.
