No additional paper ballots will be sent during the voting period. **Voting will close on Wednesday, May 15 at 12:00 pm ET.**

Please join Southwest Studies for their trip to Utah, October 6-12th, 2024.

Visit the Canyonlands and Arches National Park with an experienced guide; travel the Colorado River one evening as the history of Moab is cast upon canyon walls. Visit Newspaper Rock Monument, a rock panel caved with one of the largest known collections of petroglyphs. Journey to Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park, known by the Navajo as Tse'Bii'Ndzisgaii, is said to be one of the most photographed places on earth. The valley is host to towering sandstone rock formations that have been sculpted over time and soar 400 to 1,000 feet above the valley floor. If, this isn't enough excitement, other sites include a trip through the Colorado Monument, tour of Hovenweep National Monument, and a hands-on experience at Crow Canyon Archaeological Center.
