.In the first part of the program, we will hear from three expert panelists:

- Kathy Andrew, Division Manager, El Paso County, heading the Community Services Department, Colorado Conservation Assistance Network
- Ryan Beland, operations manager for Republic Services in Cañon City. He operated Tri-Lakes Disposal in northern El Paso County with his father from 1997 to 2020 when they sold their family-owned business to GFL
- **Jerry Cordova**, A geographer by trade, Jerry Cordova, is a specialist for the Stormwater Enterprise of the City of Colorado Springs, doing public outreach and education about where our water comes from, the importance of conservation and our natural resources, and why protecting the water we use is vital
- Specialist for the Stormwater Enterprise of the City of Colorado Springs, doing public outreach and education.

Our panelists will speak about

- 1. lessons learned across their careers and how these lessons can educate and empower us to make a difference in our community,
- 2. what key facts we all need to understand to be good stewards of our environment beyond recycling.

Then the panelists will discuss recycling and other avenues to protect our environment related to:

- 1. how they expect to continue to serve our growing community,
- 2. actions they are interested in promoting, and
- 3. ways other states, communities, and individuals are successfully addressing these issues.

Finally, they will suggest where and how community members can get involved and be part of the sustainability efforts they propose. A question-and-answer session will follow.



- 1. Click on Account Name in upper right-hand corner of Screen. You may have to login again with name & password if you are a new user.
- 2. Select My Account (upper top, right of screen) in Drop Down list
- 3. Select Community Rewards at bottom Left of Drop Down List.
- 4. Enter AAUW-Colorado Springs Branch Organization #QB289
- 5. Save your selection

**Safeway:** To donate through your Safeway shopping, you need a rechargeable card which is supplied by Robin Depies. To receive yours please contact **Robin Depies** at 719-761-1802 or email <a href="mailto:robin@heartfeltfinancialsolutions.com">robin@heartfeltfinancialsolutions.com</a>. There is no charge for the card, but when you go to Safeway, you will need to go to the Customer Service counter to load whatever amount you would like on the card, then use it when shopping at Safeway. When that amount is used, take it to customer service to reload.

For every dollar spent, our branch receives between 3% & 5% depending on how much is spent each month.
