Buzzy Jackson is the author of *To Die Beautiful*, winner of a Colorado Book Award for Historical Fiction, and a finalist for the National Jewish Book Award.

From Good Reads: a gripping and timely debut novel, based on the true story of Hannie Schaft: a heroic young Dutch woman who joined the Resistance in Holland during World War II and became one of the Nazis' most wanted women. Alongside the heartrending story of Hannie, the book offers a timely look at how fascism flourishes and what good people do to fight back.

Jackson holds a PhD in history from the University of California, Berkeley, and lives in Colorado with her family and their free-thinking dog, Ralph. She is currently at work on her next novel, inspired by a historical true crime.

Michelle Theall is the author of *The Wind Will Catch You*, an eye-opening, gritty, and hopeful novel about upheaval and resilience, forgiveness and family, love and unexpected allies, all set in motion by issues of social justice and a broken American foster care system. In this powerful story, a young woman searches for the truth about her childhood, and what she finds forever alters her beliefs about home, identity, and family. In addition to her debut novel, Theall is also the author of three nonfiction titles, including her intriguingly titled memoir, *Teaching the Cat to Sit*.

An editor at Alaska magazine and an award-winning nature photographer (think grizzly bears), Michelle Theall splits her time between Kodiak, Alaska and Boulder, Colorado with her wife, their son, and two pups.



Cheryl Sorokin has held leadership positions at the AAUW branch and national level, including serving on the national board since 2017, and is currently Board Chairman.



Pikes Peak Regional Science Fair – 2025

The AAUW Colorado Springs Branch rewarded two female scientists for their efforts at the 2025 Pikes Peak Regional Science and Engineering Fair which was held at UCCS on Sat. Feb 22nd. Sustainable energy was certainly a hot topic again this year - covering solar, wind, water, and biomass. AAUW recognized participants at both the senior high and middle school levels. Award winners were seventh-grader, Vivian Wolkow, from North Middle School and Palmer High School sophomore, Abby Rosenhahn. The winners each received a \$100 Amazon gift card.

Miss Wolkow's experiment, entitled "Investigating the visual memory of Planaria", expanded on the results of her past two year's data with planaria showing that they have memories and therefore can be trained. Interestingly, because they can regenerate in two weeks, she showed that the memories are stored throughout the body - since both halves that regenerated remembered that red meant food. Her experiment this year investigated whether the eyes in the front or the eyes along the sides of their bodies contributed the most to memory.

In "Plants built for the future: Testing the effects of different mediums on cost -effective hydroponic lettuce growth", Miss Rosenhahn attempted to differentiate six types of soils. I was intrigued by the project as our branch EAIG had visited a hydroponic farm this past year. Her goal is to develop a solution that is economically viable for third world countries and hopes to introduce her results in Thailand through an organization called 'Joy to the World'. Her biggest hurdle was trying to grow the plants without a supplemental heat/light source since scaled up, this would add to the production cost.

The Science Fair remains a crucial outlet for young ladies to demonstrate their science capabilities and garner confidence and recognition. The pictures above illustrate the amount of work these ladies put into their projects.
