

The last Saturday in April, AAUW Colorado held its Annual Meeting via Zoom. Members were treated to two timely keynote presentations:

1. Abigail Hassan, MA, LPC, LAC, Director of the Empowerment Center for Adolescence for the Community Reach Center in North Denver who spoke on how AAUW members and the community can best support the current generation of adolescent girls with their unique academic, personal, and mental health pressures and challenges.

2. **Cheryl Sorokin**, AAUW National Board Chair (through May 2025), spoke on the unprecedented challenges we're facing to higher education, equity, diversity, and inclusion, and a preview of the new AAUW Strategic Plan that focuses on higher education as the driver of equity, opportunity, and economic stability.

The Colorado Springs Branch is also well-represented on the state Executive Board. **Crystal Stebbins** was elected to serve as President-elect for AAUW Colorado 2025-2026. **Cindi Zenkert-Strange** (Colorado Springs Branch President, 2022-2023), was elected to serve as Program Vice-President, 2025-2027. **Brenda Wolfe** is currently appointed as the state Communication Chair. Colorado Springs branch member, **Sally Mathewson**, who served as Secretary for the 2024-2025 Board, was thanked for her service as she stepped down from the State Board. **Audrey McGuire**, a former co-President of the Colorado Springs Branch, was recognized for her service on the 2025 State Nominating Committee.
