AAUW Colorado Springs Business Meeting, April 12, 2025

The meeting was called to order, with a welcome by **Crystal Stebbins**, President of the Colorado Springs branch. She recognized and thanked the outgoing Board members: **Secretary, Cindy Keefe, Membership, Suzanne Kraus and Community Outreach, Marilyn Frydrych.**

The election of the new Board members followed and were presented to the members by Marian Phelps, Nominating Committee chairperson. She presented the slate of new board members: President-elect, Lorena Wilder, Secretary, Charlotte Gagne, Membership, Elizabeth Leslie, Community Outreach, Crystal Stebbins and Nominating Committee, Brenda Wolfe and Pip Bodkin. Marilyn Frydrych moved to accept the Nominating Committee report, and it was seconded by Robin Depies. Motion was approved. Thank you to our Nominating Committee and to our New Board Members.

Joan Skoog—President-Elect talked about the upcoming Authors' Day and encouraged members to invite friends and shared several auction items she brought to stimulate their interest.

All members were encouraged to sign up to be on a committee of their interest to share the work and to stimulate new ideas.

Marian Phelps, Co VP of Programs, introduced three 50-plus years members who shared some of their memories during their years with AAUW.

Vivian McWhorter joined AAUW in 1967, her first two years of college were at Mt. St. Clair in Iowa. She then went on to Iowa State Teachers College and earned a degree in Social Science. She brought memorabilia that she collected over the years- the one that stands out is a cookbook where the members shared their favorite recipes, signed their names to the recipes and sold copies of the book. They had a dinner-party to share the recipes and charged only \$5. She also shared that, at one time, they became tour guides for Colorado Springs to earn money for the Branch until the tours became too popular.

Georgina Burns joined AAUW in 1968 and graduated from UC Boulder with a degree in Elementary Education. She taught in Los Angeles, CA, and Cherry Creek in Prince Georges County, MD. Georgina told us that the first local scholarships that were offered were \$50. Branches had Study Groups instead of Interest Groups and the topics were provided by National. One year they had their own Legislative Day and invited Governor Lamm's wife, Dottie, as keynote speaker. All the Colorado legislators attended!

Candy Crumb joined AAUW in 1962 when she graduated from Colorado College with two degrees, a BA in English and American History. She spent her career teaching in District 11 schools in Colorado Springs, CO. She pointed out that originally colleges had to be accredited by AAUW to have their graduates be members. She talked about the fun she had and the friends she made at national, state and local conferences over the years, especially in Washington, DC where National had conventions every 4 years. She remembered the convention in Albuquerque when the members voted to allow male members.

Ms. Phelps acknowledged all the 50-plus years members and noted the newest member of the club is Sally Mathewson.

On behalf of the Names Honored committee, **Brenda Wolfe** presented the Branch recipients for 2025. A separate article follows.

The meeting was concluded with a warm thank you to the members for choosing to spend their Saturday with us, Appreciation was given to **Kate Meyer Olson** for taking pictures and to our Hospitality Committee for providing refreshments.

2025 Names Honored Recipients

Each year the Colorado Springs Branch contributes to National AAUW in the name of a member or members who have made significant contributions to AAUW at all levels (branch, state and national) and who have served our community.



Nancy Holt: Nancy has been a member of AAUW for 12 years. She was Branch President in 2017-18 and is currently co-chair of our DEI committee. She has helped with the STEM Day as Volunteer Lead. Nancy has also served on other committees including the Nominating committee. She received her BA in Home Economics Education from the University of Washington in Seattle in1970. After working for the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services in Child Protective Services, she went back to the UW and got her Master of Public Administration in 1976. Shortly after receiving her masters, she became a single mother of an infant daughter with the loss of her husband which changed her career path. She moved back to Oklahoma to be close to her family - supporting herself and her daughter by investing in real estate and was a landlady for over thirty years in Stillwater, Oklahoma renting to college students. She has been married to her husband, Smith, for 24 years, whom many of you have met, as he is a supportive member of AAUW.

Audrey McGuire: Audrey has been a member of AAUW for 7 years. She was Branch co-president last year and is currently co-chair of our DEI committee, where she has served since 2021,and is a member of the State Nominating committee. She has a passion for Public Policy and has been our PP Director and recently represented us in Nov. on the League of Women Voters election program panel. She graduated from Baldwin Wallace College with a BA in Philosophy and then received an MA Ed in Counseling from East Carolina University. She began her career as a teacher in East Harlem, NY. With the move to Colorado in 1985 with her husband and two sons, she assumed a position as an elementary school counselor for Harrison District 2, Colorado Springs. She retired in 2005. She joined the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center Docent program in 2006 and served as Docent President, 2013-2014. Environmental Action Interest Group



At our AAUW branch's business meeting on April 12 our Environmental Action Interest Group announced the winner of our recycling challenge incoming Branch President, Joan Skogg. Joan, with the help of a number of people in her network, collected a whopping 125 pounds of plastic in 4 months. We also announced that the recipient of the 2024-25 recycling campaign for a free Trex bench is The LaunchPad. This new facility is a 50-unit permanent supportive apartment home community for young adults aged 18 to 24. It's not a shelter; instead, residents commit to a 1-year lease. Within The Launchpad, The PLACE assumes the role of providing secure support and fostering connections among the young adult tenants.
