



Below is the statement from AAUW regarding the passage of the reconciliation bill:

An Act to Provide for Reconciliation Pursuant to Title II of H. Con. Res. 14".

"For AAUW, this is personal. We are the nation's largest non-institutional funder of women's graduate education. For more than 140 years, we've fought to open the doors of higher education to all women — not just those who can afford it. And we know the truth: when women lose access to education, they lose access to opportunity, economic security, and equity."

AAUW will continue to be at the forefront with plans of action to support all students with attaining "full and equal access to education, civil rights and opportunity."

Students from STEM DAY, October, 2023

The fourth annual STEM Day will be held **Friday, November 7 at Hillside Community Center from 7:30 to 2:00.** This year our guest experiment Bungee Dolls will be presented by UCCS' **Lynanne George, PhD.** We'll need 40 to 50 volunteers, so mark your calendar now. For those unable to attend on November 7th, there is still plenty to do beforehand. Since we will be asking the schools to pack the girls' lunches this year, there will be about 10 less volunteers needed STEM DAY. However, we will absolutely try to spread out pre-STEM DAY responsibilities with as many volunteers as possible. In the past our STEM Committee has handled many responsibilities that we are ready to teach others how to accomplish.

We are also planning a second STEM day in February for forty highly-motivated 7th grade science students. Colorado Springs Utilities has agreed to set up experiments on filtration at their Mesa Road facilities and include a tour of their filtering plant, just to the south at Mesa Road and Fillmore. Our contribution will be to identify the forty girls, gain parental support for their trip, work with the science teachers to make this happen, supply lunch, and arrange bus transportation with certified chaperones.
