



Below is the statement from AAUW regarding the passage of the reconciliation bill:

AAUW Year End Financials For Year Ending June 30, 2025

We ended the fiscal year in good financial shape spending \$536.36 less than our income. Our membership income is more than budgeted. Most of our operating income is generated through our Branch dues and an occasional donation to our General Fund. We did get a \$500 donation for our General Fund from Thrivent thanks to **Joan Skoog**. Thank you, Joan. We had a successful Author's Day which netted us \$11,659.11. Through the Kroger and Safeway programs, we were able to donate \$1,032.84 to the National AAUW Greatest Needs Fund. Below is the detailed financial statement.

Environmental Action IG August 13 Trip

Our Environmental Action Interest Group members are reducing plastic pollution by collecting grocery bags and other plastic items and have provided 5 local nonprofits (Concrete Couch, Voces Unidas for Justice, CPCD Headstart, Milllibo Art Center and The Place) with a NEXTREX bench with more to come. Previously, NEXTREX required 500 lbs of plastic to qualify for the bench. This year they upped it to 1000 lbs, which we have already collected!

Our most recent activity was touring the Colorado Springs Utilities Water treatment plant on Mesa Drive. The Plant Manager, Marcus, took us through the facility, carefully explaining the processes. We came away feeling well informed and grateful that our water is in good hands. We learned that the large, covered tank at Fillmore and Mesa Dr. contains the finished filtered water that originates from Pikes Peak's reservoirs. From there it is distributed to one-fourth of Colorado Springs. No fluoride is added to the raw water. Rather, some must be removed.

Our bi-monthly programs are outings to local recycling centers, farms, and businesses in the sustainable field. Join us.
